This January brought significant snowfall and cold weather, prompting most of us to stay warm and snug in our homes. Nevertheless, activities continued at Kinder Farm Park. Here is an overview.

I would like to extend a warm welcome to Debby Hartten, who has joined our board. She has assumed responsibility for the commemorative brick program and has also volunteered to assist with our Speakers Series. We anticipate engaging discussions on a variety of interesting topics.

I would like to express my gratitude to the Park Rangers and the Farm Livestock and Education Program volunteers for their diligent efforts in feeding, watering, and generally caring for our animals during the cold and snowy weather. Watering troughs were checked to prevent freezing, animals were fed, and barns were kept clean. This is a significant task in good weather, but it is doubly challenging during the winter. Thank you!

The winter breeding program is underway, ensuring that this spring there will be new animals for all of us to greet and enjoy. We even have some piglets on the way, expected to be born in late January. Our "Meet the Kids" event should be exciting.

We are currently reworking our pasture space, installing new fencing, and reconfiguring the pasture area. This will enable better use of the pastures through improved animal rotation. It will also allow certain areas to be left fallow, thereby enabling natural nutrient restoration to the land. Our sawmill and woodshop clubs have contributed to this project by supplying cut lumber for the fences. This initiative is part of the ongoing educational mission of the Friends Group.

members and non-members and can be ordered through Ticket Leap. Admission is free for Friends' members, \$3 for non-members, and will be limited to 90 people.

Laura Falvey, a certified guide with the Association

of Nature and Forest
Therapy, will talk about
the wonderful
experiences associated
with Forest Bathing in a
natural environment.
Forest Bathing is a slow
walk along trails, like
those at Kinder Farm



Park, which allows participants to tap into their senses and immerse themselves in the beautiful world around them. Slowing down and spending mindful time in nature has been proven to regulate blood pressure, increase immunity, and reduce the production of stress hormones. One can expect to feel relaxed, refreshed, and connected to the natural environment after a guided walk. She will offer guided walks later this spring for a nominal fee.

### Meet Stella and Her New Brood

The Farm Livestock and Education Program (FLEP) received a New Bred Gilt (first time birthing Pig) on Tuesday, December 3, 2024, from a breeder named Aubry Knott of KFF Showpigs in Mt. Airy MD. The Gilt is a registered Chester White swine and was bred with a Crossbred boar from Hamby Show Pigs.



Her formal name is Dame Stellaluna Purdy Piggleton of Kinder Farm Park Pigtown. But you can call her "Stella".

The Chester White swine breed is a solid white hog with drooped ears that originated in Chester County, Pennsylvania. The Chester White is the most durable of the white breeds; it can gain as much as 1.36lbs (0.62 kg) a day and gain 1lb (0.45 kg) for every 3lbs (1.4 kg) of grain it is fed. Their pale color leaves Chester Whites prone to sunburn; they must be given access to shade in the summer.

These white hogs with droopy, medium-sized ears are known for their mothering ability, durability and soundness. Chester hogs are a maternal breed, known for raising large litters, and heavy milk production.

Stella was bred on September 29 -so her expected delivery date was January 21, 2025 (Pig Gestation is 3 months, 3 weeks, 3 days -114 days total), but Stella surprised us all on Friday, January 17 by having her piglets early.

She gave birth to 8 piglets, unfortunately 3 were

stillborn and another passed later; but, we now have four beautiful baby piglets. Now that Stella is a mother, she has earned the title, "Sow". Her two males and two females will stay in FLEP until weaning



and then be sold to 4H families for raising and showing at the county fair as their 2025 Pig Projects.

#### 4-H New Animals at the Farm

There are four new 4-H large animals since our last update: three goats and one steer. Our club will be getting more new animals in the next few months, so we expect our next update to be even bigger.

The three new breeding goats are Debbie, Raven, and Praylene. When you own a breeding goat, you come to the farm every day to care for your goat. When she is old enough, you can breed her and raise or sell the babies.

Often, other 4-H youth are looking for new projects, so they will buy the baby goats from you. With this income, you can purchase the feed and supplies needed for your animals.

Hi, my name is Charlotte, I'm a 10-year-old 4-H member. This is my third year in 4-H. I have raised 2 chickens, Bridgette and Jolene, a turkey named Malorie as well as a goat, Praylene. I will be writing about her today.

Praylene's birthday is April 17th, 2024, she is a Nigerian Dwarf goat, her mother, Princess Astrid Vega was bred with Farland Farms Wild Times. When we went to meet Praylene, Mrs. Ruth and Miss Dani introduced her to me and taught me about her breed and things to know about her care. They told me what the judges will look for at the fair and what makes Praylene a great goat. I loved her so much and I immediately knew she was the one.

Her original name is the same but spelled differently, it was Praline. I decided to change the spelling because I love God, so I added a 'Pray' into her name! I always knew I wanted to raise a goat since the summer of 2024, when I helped milk Bacardi and Astrid, Praylene's mom and aunt.

According to 4-H, I would actually be too young to own a goat. But the 4-H members took a vote and allowed me this opportunity. My family and I visited many goat owners in the area. I had two favorites which were Praylene and Forrest. I really enjoyed Praylene.

# Parents and Children Learn Organic Gardening by Doing!

Would you and your children like to grow your own organic vegetables? Then join us, Master Gardeners and other families, in the Apprentice Garden.

The Apprentice Garden at Kinder Farm Park is a program organized by the University of Maryland Extension Service Master Gardeners. It occupies two of the community garden spaces and is dedicated to teaching families with children to grow their own produce organically. The program can host eight families. Each family has a personal garden space and shares the care and harvest of the common garden areas. The Master Gardeners and families meet every Wednesday at 6:30 pm to plant, weed, water, de-bug, fret over, learn, and harvest their own garden-grown vegetables, fruits, and herbs.



In the personal plots, families plant their own unique choice of seeds and sets. The 2024 garden had a wide variety of vegetables: tomatoes and peppers; cucumbers, okra, yellow squash, and zucchini; lettuces, kale, beans, peas, radishes; broccoli; strawberries, potatoes, and herbs. Families shared the bounty of their garden spaces, and everyone shares the vegetables grown in the common areas, including potatoes, tomatoes, tomatillos, peppers, okra, strawberries, and herbs.

If you visit the Apprentice Garden now, you will find crimson cover crop growing in the planting areas and newspapers covered with straw on the pathways. The crimson clover will nourish the soil with nitrogen this winter and will also prevent weeds from choking the planting areas. In addition to the winter preparation for the family plots and common planting areas, the

perennials, strawberry plants, and herb garden have been bedded down for winter.

Planning is underway for the Apprentice Garden for 2025. If you are interested in more information or would like to join us this season, please contact Janet Clauson at janetclauson301@gmail.com.

The Apprentice Garden project meets from April through September, on Wednesdays at 6:30 pm at the community gardens at Kinder Farm Park in Millersville.


### Fantastic Gift Opportunity!

### Kinder Farm Park's 25th Anniversary Celebrated in Poster by Arnold Artist

Designed by local artist Joe Barsin, a resident of Arnold, the 18-by-24-inch poster features a one-of-a-kind illustration of all that the beloved park has to offer: farm animals, athletic facilities, a playground, barn, farmhouse and more, all tied together by the iconic windmill.



Barsin, who teaches gaming and simulation at Anne Arundel County Public Schools' Center of Applied Technology South, shared that he has designed commemorative posters for other county parks including Quiet Waters Park and Downs Park, but the opportunity to create artwork for Kinder Farm Park was uniquely special.

"I love Kinder Farm Park ... I've been to all of (the county parks) with my kids, but this one is specifically the closest to my heart," he said. Barsin explained that he spent many days at Kinder Farm Park with his two sons, who are now in their 20s, at the playground, meeting the farm animals, and playing sports.

"It's been a joy to be a part of the park system because it's been such a big part of our life," he added.

### **RULES AND ENTRY INSTRUCTIONS**

- 1. The categories for this photo competition are **Flora** (flowers, trees, plants, etc.); **Fauna** (all animals including fishes, birds, insects, etc.); **Landscape**; and **People** in Kinder Farm Park.
- 2. Photos <u>must</u> be taken within the boundaries of Kinder Farm Park between March 1, 2024, and February 28, 2025.
- 3. Participants may submit up to a total of <u>four</u> photos in the competition, in any of the categories, either in color or black and white.
  - All photographs must be in digital format (preferably in JPG), although they need not be taken with a digital cameras. Scans are acceptable so long as they meet the requirements of these rules.
  - Cell phone photos are acceptable.
- 4. This competition is intended to encourage amateur photography, contest entries will <u>not</u> be accepted from professional photographers.
- 5. All entries must be original work and must not have been previously published. Participants must be the sole owner of copyright in all photos entered and must have obtained permission of any people featured in the entries.
- 6. Each entry must be accompanied by the following information:
  - The photographer's (parent/guardian's contact info is acceptable if photographer's name and age are identified):
    - Name and address
    - o Telephone number
    - Email address
  - Photograph title
  - A description of where and the date the photo was taken
  - The category in which each photograph is being entered (only one category per photo)
  - Notes:
    - o Entries will be returned if they lack any of the above requested information.
    - Personal details will only be used for the purpose of administering the competition and will not be published or provided to any third party without your permission.
- 7. Entries must be emailed to **photocontest@kinderfarmpark.org** with the subject line of "2024 Life in the Park Photo Contest.
- 8. All entries must be received by February 28, 2025.
- 9. The Grand Prize-winning photo will be ineligible for additional prizes in the category in which it was entered.
- 10. No entries can be returned, and proof of posting is not proof of receipt. The organizers accept no responsibility for entries lost, damaged, or delayed in the post.
- 11. All entries will be judged by a panel of judges who will select the best photographs in each category. The judges' decision will be final, and no correspondence can be entered into.
- 12. By entering, participants will be deemed to have agreed to be bound by these rules.
- 13. By entering the competition, entrants grant the right for The Friends of Kinder Farm Park to display the photographs at Kinder Farm Park; publish and exhibit the submitted photographs in print and on the Friends of Kinder Farm Park website.
- 14. Prize winners will be invited to attend a Friends Meeting to receive their prizes, if unable to attend, the winners will be asked to pick up their prize at the Visitors Center.


